The 2017 ranking approach utilizes Bonus funds to expand funding for renewal projects assisting chronically homeless clients with intensive service needs. The rankings prioritize preserving funding for existing PSH projects and projects that support HUD mandated functions (HMIS and Coordinated Entry). Lower ranking projects are priotized in the following way: PSH expansion to fund facility-based units located in Cambridge and linked to an existing renewal grant (Bridge PSH); Rapid Rehousing renewal project; and PSH expansions to support additional staff and scattered site units for existing projects serving chronically homeless individuals (Key and Going Home) and chronically homeless families fleeing domestic violence (Transition House PSH Expansion).
